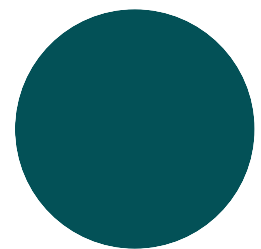

Community Living

Search opened its first home in 1968, creating a supportive place for five people to live in the community. Today, **170 people are thriving** as part of our Community Living program (CL), which includes **28 homes across Chicago, Skokie, Mount Prospect and Morton Grove.**

At the heart of Community Living is the idea of home. For people we support, it is the foundation for independence, personal growth and meaningful relationships. In a secure and comfortable setting, people can pursue their interests, build lasting friendships and take part in their communities in ways that reflect who they are.

Life in the CL program extends beyond the home. People take part in their communities, attend Day Services, work, form friendships and share experiences that enrich daily life. Our team of Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) provides **24/7 support**, offering help with goal-setting, transportation, community activities and more. Through the Community Living program, people have the support and opportunities to build full and connected lives.



Self-Directed Assistance

Search's Self-Directed Assistance (SDA) program empowers people to take control of their services and supports, helping them live independently and make choices that fit their lives.

In FY25, **67 people and their families used** the SDA program to manage their services while continuing to live in their own homes or family homes. SDA offers guidance in finding, hiring and working with Personal Support Workers who respect each person's needs and preferences. SDA also helps with budgeting, managing SDA funding, timekeeping and other employer-related tasks.

Through SDA, people gain the confidence and tools to make their own decisions and direct their care. Many also choose Search as their Day Services provider. Self-Directed Assistance supports people across Chicagoland, including Glenview, Northbrook, Schaumburg, Skokie, Arlington Heights, Chicago, Wilmette, Park Ridge, Evanston, Mount Prospect and beyond.



Day Services

Day Services (DS) offers meaningful experiences for people across four Search sites, one intermediate care facility and in the community or at home. Each month, an average of **253 people** take part in a range of opportunities that support connection, learning and personal growth.

In FY25, people participated in more than **2,965 community activities** across the Chicagoland area, traveling by public transit, Search vans and on foot as they explored everything from local parks to major cultural destinations. They spent over 17,000 hours visiting places such as the Marriott Theatre, Metropolis Performing Arts Centre, the Museum of Science and Industry, the Field Museum, the Art Institute of Chicago, Shedd Aquarium, Brookfield Zoo and more. A group of people supported by Search also proudly marched in the Chicago Disability Pride Parade, representing themselves, Search and the broader disability community.

Through these shared experiences, Day Services helps people build relationships, discover new interests and stay connected to their communities.

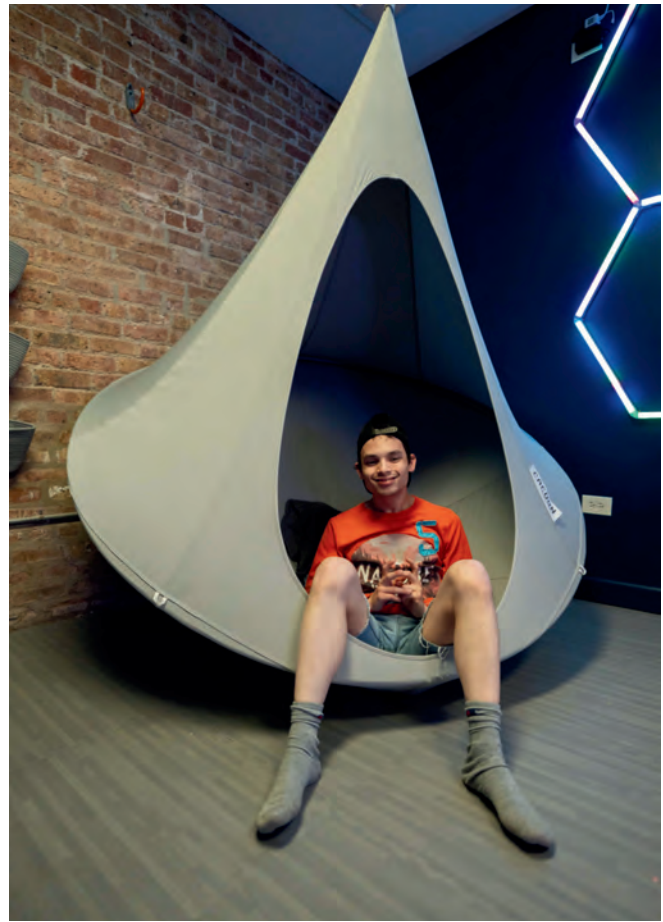


Career Services

Career Services connects people to meaningful employment in the community, offering job coaching and ongoing support to ensure long-term success. In FY25, **11 people achieved integrated, competitive employment**, and **51 people were supported** across the program. Through partnerships with more than 20 employers, including The Fresh Market, Tony's Finer Foods, TJ Maxx, HomeGoods, Macy's, Sheraton Suites Chicago O'Hare, Food 4 Less, Jewel-Osco and Rivers Casino, we continue to create pathways for people to enter and grow in the workforce.

Youth Services provides transition information and resources to students, teachers and families as they prepare for life after high school. In FY25, a **\$25,000 grant from the Special Kids Foundation** helped expand this work through tours of our Community Living and Day Services sites and **31 informational events** across eight high schools and two townships.

These efforts reached more than **400 students and families**. Partnerships, including with Taft High School, strengthened these connections and increased awareness of community-based adult services.



Clinical Services

Clinical Services at Search360 include both medical and behavioral health supports. In FY25, we coordinated more than **6,100 medical appointments** and provided **14,636 hours of behavioral health support** for over **170 people**. These services primarily support people in our Community Living program (CL), and clinical staff work closely with the CL team to ensure people have consistent access to the care they need.

Care coordination guides our Medical Services, bringing together primary care, nursing and on-site specialty care at our Chicago and Mount Prospect clinics. These services include women’s health, vision, neurology, nutrition, lab work and diagnostic testing and support each person’s ongoing health and well-being.

Behavioral health services are delivered by a team of 13 licensed therapists and clinicians and include individual and group counseling, as well as specialized therapies such as art therapy and sensory integration therapy. Behavioral health services help people build coping skills and strengthen emotional well-being.



Behavioral Health Clinic

In November 2025, Search launched our Behavioral Health Clinic (BHC) offering, a new service model that expands behavioral health support to the broader community. Developed over two years, the BHC brings flexible, community-based mental health care to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. **Seven people began care** at launch, marking the beginning of a growing community-based model of support.

Unlike traditional clinics, the BHC is mobile and flexible. Licensed clinicians provide therapy in a person's home, a neutral community location or at a Search site, meeting people where they are and reducing barriers to care.

BHC services include assessment and treatment planning, individual, group and family therapy, community support services and medication administration and training. Our clinical team helps people identify goals, build coping skills and strengthen emotional well-being in safe, respectful environments.



Search for Adventure

Search for Adventure (SFA) provides people in our Community Living program the opportunity to explore the world beyond their front door through inclusive travel experiences. Since its launch in 2004, SFA has made **more than 200 trips to 51 destinations**, made possible through the generous support of our partner Toad&Co. and their commitment to 1% for the Planet.

In 2025, **66 people embarked on six unforgettable trips**. Adventures included visits to Fair Oaks Farms, Moab, the Apostle Islands, Kansas City, Branson, the Fireside Dinner Theatre in Ft Atkinson, Wisconsin and the Special Olympics State Games. One group chose to travel to Springfield, joining others for an Advocacy Day to support the protection of Medicaid and improve access to community-based supports.

From planning and transportation to lodging and travel support, the SFA team is here to make each traveler's experience safe, personal and memorable. We are proud to look back on a year filled with adventure and look forward to many more ahead.

VISIBILITY ARTS



Visibility Arts

Visibility Arts provides space for adult artists with intellectual and developmental disabilities to explore, learn, create and showcase their art. In 2025, artists participated in **21 community shows and events**, generating **\$13,742** in combined art and product sales. Their curated product line, including prints, glassware, candles, cards, bags and stickers, is available at art shows, community events and Planet Access in Lincoln Square.

Visibility Arts hosted its first Print n' Sip in 2025, a hands-on gel plate printing class that welcomed **38 attendees** and **raised \$1,500**. The artists continued to expand their presence through exhibitions and partnerships with Park School and City Elementary, as well as shows at One River School of Art + Design, Open Studio Project, Evanston Made Makers Market and Dittmar Gallery.

As part of our rebrand, we introduced a new Visibility Arts logo featuring original artwork by Visibility Artist Abby S., reflecting the creativity and leadership of artists across the program.



PLANET ACCESS



Planet Access

Planet Access is one of Search's longest-standing social ventures, created in partnership with Toad&Co. to combine purpose-driven retail with meaningful opportunities for the people we support. In FY25, the store reached **\$682,317 in sales**, reflecting strong community support and the continued success of this mission-driven collaboration.

Throughout the year, Planet Access hosted its third annual Winter Windows event in collaboration with Visibility Arts and partnered with local businesses to create unique products. As part of our rebrand, we also introduced a new Planet Access logo featuring original artwork by Visibility Artist Abby S.

Looking ahead, Planet Access will expand its impact with a **second location** opening in Chicago's Wicker Park neighborhood in 2026 and will rebuild its online platform. These efforts will increase revenue to support travel experiences, expand inclusive employment for job seekers and create more ways for Visibility Artists to share their talents with the community.



Community Education

In FY25, Search's community education and advocacy initiatives reached more than **2,300 people** across Chicagoland, expanding awareness and inclusion for people with disabilities. Through these efforts, individuals supported by Search actively engage their communities, helping advance understanding and create a more accessible future.

Disability Awareness Training (DAT)

Disability Awareness Training equips organizations with practical tools to strengthen disability-aware customer service and inclusive employment practices. Led by the Players, an interactive troupe of people with disabilities, the program delivers engaging and memorable learning experiences. In FY25, the Players hosted **18 trainings**, reaching **649 participants**. Organizations that completed trainings include the Driehaus Museum, Argonne National Laboratory, Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum, The Alliance and Northbrook Public Library.

In 2025, we also launched an innovative online training platform to help businesses and organizations better engage with people with disabilities. The course features video interviews with four people with disabilities as they share their stories, giving learners insight through lived experience.



NeurodiVERSED: Live Uninterrupted

Each March, we highlight NeurodiVERSED, an annual campaign during National Developmental Disabilities Month that celebrates neurodiversity and promotes mental health awareness. In 2025, the campaign spotlighted artist, advocate and athlete Anthony, showcasing the power of inclusion through themes of community, acceptance and embracing neurodiversity.

We also hosted **four** in-person NeurodiVERSED trainings, reaching **180 participants**. These sessions were designed to deepen understanding of neurodiversity and strengthen belonging across workplaces, schools and community organizations.

Hop on the Bus to Independence

In partnership with Pace Suburban Bus, Hop on the Bus trainings help people with disabilities learn to use fixed-route public transit safely and independently. In FY25, we reached **520 students and staff** across **17 workshops**.

ComEd Energy Force Ambassador Program

Every year, a person supported by Search serves as an Energy Force Ambassador through the ComEd Energy Force Program, the nation's first energy-efficiency initiative led by people with disabilities. In FY25, our Ambassador, Pam, led **nine community events**.

Community Education Through the Arts

Through support from the Evanston Arts Council Cultural Fund Grant, **10 Visibility Artists** partnered with three Evanston groups to lead hands-on art classes that fostered creativity, confidence and shared expression, highlighting the power of artists with disabilities as leaders in their community.

Trailblazers: The Stories That Connect Us

On June 5, 2025, we gathered at the Carter in Chicago's West Loop for Trailblazers: The Stories That Connect Us, an evening celebrating the stories that have shaped us and honoring our history as Search Inc. With strong community support, the event **raised more than \$175,000**.

We recognized Keystone Alliance Communications Director Shawn Durr and Just Storytelling Creative Director Justin Lynk for their work in amplifying the voices of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and those supported at Search. Their partnerships with Search have helped empower people to share their own stories through person-centered media that strengthen inclusion.

As our largest annual fundraiser, this year's Trailblazers was our most successful yet, with a **21 percent increase** over the previous year. We are grateful to our sponsors, donors and attendees for supporting our programs and for their commitment to empowering people with disabilities.



Endeavor Health

In 2025, Search360 received a **\$211,108 grant** from the Endeavor Health Community Investment Fund to expand behavioral health access for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and co-occurring mental health conditions in Cook County. The grant supported the launch of our community Behavioral Health Clinic, increasing access to specialized services for people who often face significant barriers to care.

With this support, Search360 opened the Behavioral Health Clinic and introduced a sensory-friendly room at our Lincoln site, designed to provide a calm, supportive environment for people with diverse sensory needs. The grant also helped build new partnerships and referral networks, extending services across Search360 locations, in our homes and throughout the community. The sensory space now benefits **more than 75 people**.

Endeavor Health's partnership strengthens Search360's ability to offer accessible, person-centered behavioral health services and reflects a shared commitment to building healthier, more inclusive communities.



Rivers Casino Partnership

Since 2018, Search and Rivers Casino Des Plaines have built a strong partnership focused on creating meaningful employment opportunities for people with disabilities. In 2025, Rivers contributed **\$30,000 to support our services** and expand opportunities across our community. What began with a single hire through our Career Services program has grown into a sustained collaboration, with Rivers adjusting its interview process, providing accessible training and promoting an inclusive workplace, leading to the successful **placement of seven job candidates** from our Career Services program.

Rivers' commitment extends beyond employment. In 2025, their team joined us for Rivers Gives Day of Service, spending the day gardening at our Kensington site alongside Search staff and volunteers. Their energy helped create a more welcoming outdoor space for the people we support.

Rivers also generously sponsored our Trailblazers event in June 2025. We are grateful for this partnership and look forward to continued collaboration that strengthens inclusion across our community.

Ralla Klepak Foundation for Education in the Performing Arts

Search is grateful to be a grantee of the Ralla Klepak Foundation for Education in the Performing Arts. In 2025, the Foundation awarded a **\$67,000 grant that funded 13 theater experiences for 90 people**, strengthening our connection to the arts and honoring Ralla Klepak's enduring legacy as a passionate advocate for people with disabilities.

The Foundation's support brought theater to the center of our community life. In 2025, we attended six shows, including Grease at the Metropolis Performing Arts Centre and Beetlejuice at the Cadillac Palace Theatre, along with holiday performances such as Million Dollar Quartet Christmas at the Marriott Theatre and Elf The Musical with Broadway in Chicago.

We are deeply appreciative of this partnership and look forward to many more opportunities for our community to experience the joy of live theater.

In 2025, we invested **\$879,240 in wage increases** and **\$654,231 in bonuses** to recognize our staff and strengthen recruitment and retention.

We continued to expand professional development through additional PHI training to support effective communication and strengthen supervisors' coaching skills. We also advanced our diversity efforts through the Outward Inclusion program developed with the Arbinger Institute.
